

In the past 10 years, Hibernia College students have:


- Completed more than 12.5 million online learning hours

In the same period, Hibernia College staff have:


- Published more than 3,500 content packages

A Virtual Video Network for Hibernia College




Key Questions for your event

Essential tasks

A. Install and test Zoom.

Important: These steps must be completed by Wednesday, 22 April at 5 p.m.

- 1. Download and install **Zoom Client for Meetings**.
- 2. Join a <u>test meeting</u> to check your audio works properly.
- 3. Go to the **Zoom Resources** page and watch these three tutorial videos:
 - Joining a Meeting
 - Joining & Configuring Audio & Video
 - Meeting Controls

B. Attend the Zoom trial event on 22 April.

To ensure that you are correctly set up to attend Orientation Day, you must attend the Zoom trial event, which will be hosted by the Technical Support Team. During this trial event, the team will check that Zoom is working correctly for you and that you are ready to attend online events.

Customising your profile


