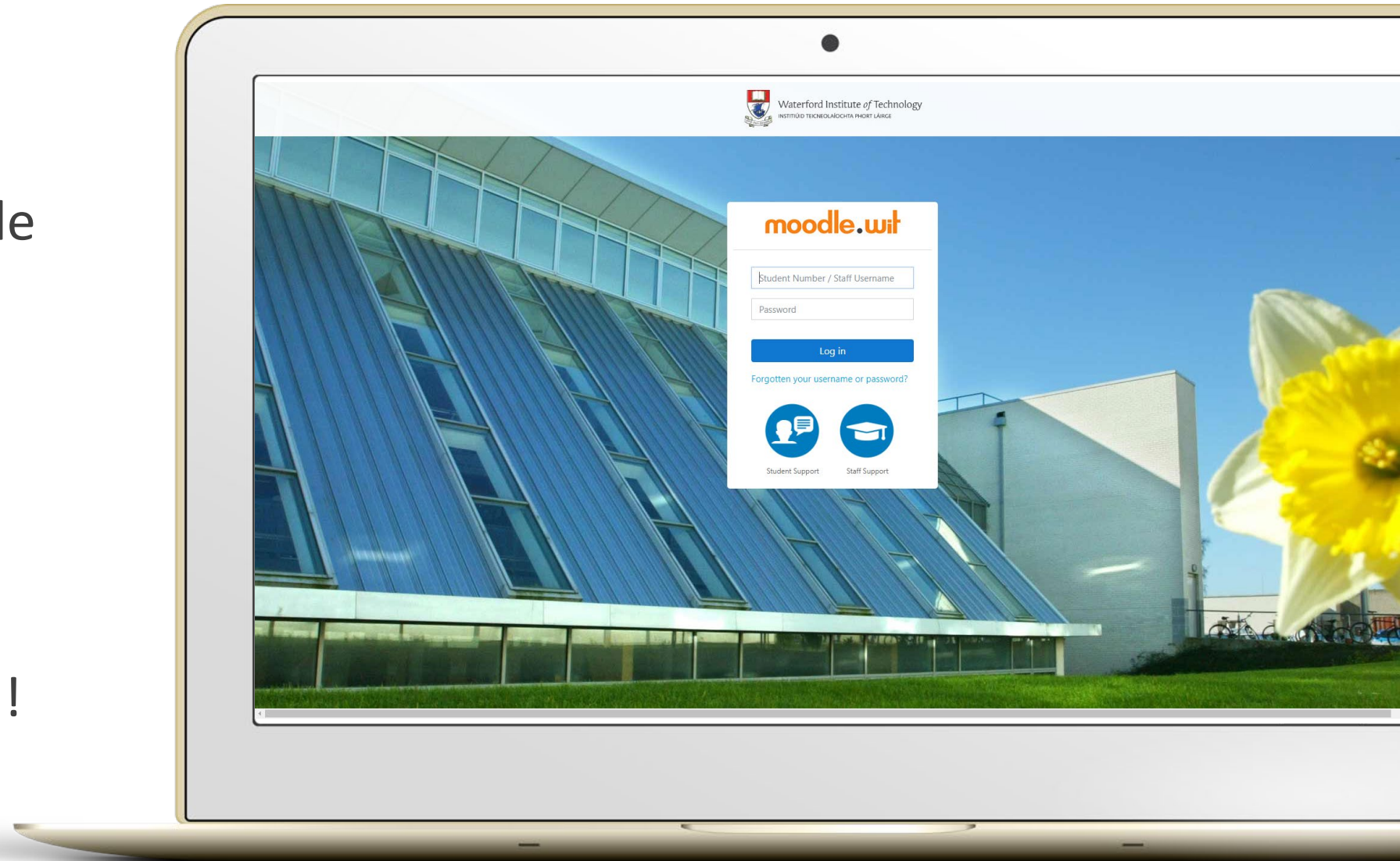

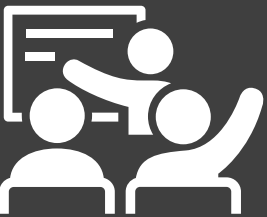

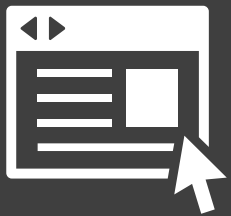

Some Ideas



Get everyone to introduce themselves including all the students



Ask people to keep their camera on during the session



Direct people to the chat/messaging function so people can share their questions during any presentation



Keep presentations short and easy to understand



All presenters use the same presentation file format for consistency reasons - maybe someone coordinated the collection of presentations and builds one large file.



Take a break for questions after each segment

Some More Ideas



Try to include more images in presentations and make sure the language is clear



Appoint a host for the session who invites each contributor to present/share their input



Ask more questions to students during the presentation



Consider using Mentimeter (<https://www.mentimeter.com/>) for questions to students (This may mean they may need two devices)



Keep the session to about 45 minutes



Be clear on when the next or first session is and what we expect them to do next



Get the lecturer to introduce course content

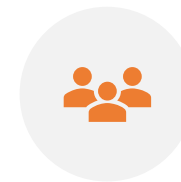
