

- Discuss best practices for improving institutional approaches to supporting international students in relation to health and wellbeing.





## Pre-Travel Checklist for students who have a medical condition or who are taking regular medication 1 I have discussed the pros and cons of living in a foreign country with my medical condition/s with my medical provider in my own country. I have a letter confirming my diagnosis and treatment plan from my medical provider. Regarding any medication I am bringing my medication with me, OR I have checked that my medication is readily available in Ireland, OR If my treatment is not available in Ireland, I have discussed an alternative treatment with my provider that is available, and I am happy to proceed with my travel plans. How do I find out if my medication is available in Ireland? What are my options if my medication is unavailable? I understand that my treatment may need specialist supervision whilst I am studying in Ireland and that there may be delays getting an appointment with a specialist. If my particular condition is high risk and requires continuity specialist treatment without interruption, my medical provider has organised this prior to my travel.




