



































Inclusive Environment Fund

Additional round of funding under Strand 4 of the Programme for Access to Higher Education (PATH 4) is centred on measures to foster and enhance belonging for the most underrepresented groups.

"PATH 4 funding has played a key role in enabling the development of the ALTITUDE Charter, which presents a significant opportunity to advance progress towards inclusive environments in a strategic, holistic and student-centred manner...The HEA is actively encouraging institutions to commit Inclusive Environment funding to supporting the next phase of full adoption and implementation of the Charter."

Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Enhancement Fund

Inaugural call of the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Enhancement Fund 2024 to support equality, diversity, and inclusion initiatives in Irish higher education institutions.

Seven projects were funded under the 2024 call. The projects address important areas of development for the higher education sector including training and capacity building, research, and supporting sectoral collaboration and networks.

European University Alliances

Thirteen Irish HEIs are engaged in European University Alliances (EUAs) that aim to transform the European HE landscape. While these alliances collaborate in areas like research, teaching and mobility, all include initiatives designed to amplify the student voice.

EngageAll: The All-Ireland Community of Practice (CoP) for Professionals involved in Student Engagement within European University Alliances

Erasmus+ supports training periods for staff working in higher education institutions. EU grants provide a contribution to your costs for travel and subsistence during your time abroad.

Erasmus+

With Erasmus+, you can train at a higher education institution in an Erasmus+ Programme or Partner country or at an organisation outside the sector in a Programme country.

Examples of such organisations include businesses, public bodies, social partners, research institutes and non-governmental organisations. A training period between two Programme countries must last a minimum of 2 days and cannot last more than 2 months.
